Foundation Safety and Rescue Training

Sandy is seeking to become an official provider for this training course and has to present a course during which he will be assessed by an established course provider. He is planning to do this on Saturday 25 April 2015. He needs at least six volunteers to work with on this date. They need to be of 2 star standard although they don't actually have to be holders of the 2 star award. The course is held on flat water and does involve getting wet, however you will learn loads. 
Please email Sandy on the link above (previous article) if you are interested. Again this is a valuable formal course which is a prerequisite for further awards or to become a coach. It is described as,

This course is designed for all paddlers irrespective of craft. The objective is to teach simple and safe skills that can be applied appropriately across a variety of paddlesport craft including kayaks and canoes. These skills will then form the basis of all safety and rescue training throughout the BCU Scheme.

The course aims to provide the student with the key safety and rescue skills required to operate safely in a sheltered water environment and to be able to deal with common emergencies.

So no need for swimming in white water....that's a different course!

The club is underwriting the costs involved so it's the ideal opportunity to pick up some knowledge to make you a safer paddler and provide you with the skills to rescue those around you.
