**River Cononish:** Into February and on the 27<sup>th</sup> we have another trip, this time it is on the River Cononish which starts at Crianlarich and the get out is at Loch Dochart a distance of some 5km. This is a short trip but a well worth while trip. This is a Grade 1 river and flows into a Loch. The meeting time is 8.30am at the stores or 10am at Crianlarich.

**Leven to Burntisland:** This is a 22km trip that takes the incoming tide to follow the Fife coastline.
